It also provides an official record of your membership and is essential for sacramental preparations and sponsorship certification.

Sacrament of Baptism

Parents must be registered members of the Parish and in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church. Participation in the Pre-Baptismal Program is required. Parents must register by calling the parish office.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made with the Pastor at least six months in advance. Participation in Marriage Preparation Workshop is required.

Sacrament of Anointing

The sacrament is celebrated upon request prior to surgery or at the time of illness. Please notify the Parish office of the illness or hospitalization of a parishioner.

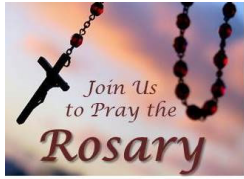

SAINTS OF THE DAY

June 22 **Thomas More** Died in 1535; was beheaded; humanist and chancellor of England; wrote *Utopia*; refused to support Henry VIII's divorce and his Act of Supremacy; patron of lawyers, statesmen and politicians.

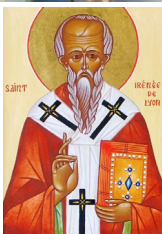
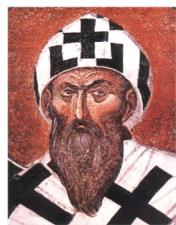
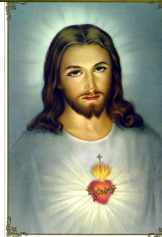
June 24 **Nativity of John the Baptist** This feast, dating from the 4th century, came to be celebrated 6 months before the Lord's birth.

June 27 **Sacred Heart of Jesus** First celebrated on August 31, 1670, in France; the visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque made it universal; in these June 16, 1675 visions Jesus appeared and asked St. Margaret Mary to request that the Feast of the Sacred Heart be celebrated on the Friday after the octave of the Feast of Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men for the sacrifice that Christ had made for them. The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents not simply His physical heart but His love for all mankind.

June 27 **Cyril of Alexandria** Died in 444; bishop; doctor of the Church; spokesman for orthodoxy; noted especially for his Christological formulations; supported growth of Egyptian monasticism.

June 28 **Immaculate Heart of Mary** is a name used to refer to the interior life of the Blessed Virgin Mary, her joys and sorrows, her virtues and hidden perfections, and, above all, her virginal love for God the Father, her maternal love for her son Jesus, and her compassionate love for all persons.

June 28 **Irenaeus** Died around 202; bishop of Lyons for 25 years; wrote against the Gnostics; first to provide a coherent rationale for a Christian Bible including both testaments, and the first to offer a comprehensive account of belief in God's universal providential and redemptive economy.

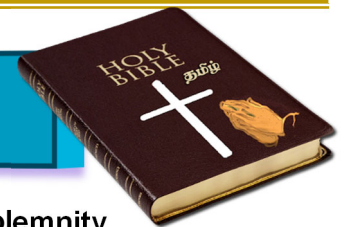
